One of the top ticket sellers is Lion Dr. Pat Moran, who has sold \$65,134 in Carnival Raffle tickets during his 42 years as a member of the GJ Lions.

Pat joined the club in January of 1968 and was sponsored by Bill Prescott, a second-generation member of the GJ Lions. Pat was joined St. Mary's in 1967 as an internist and medical oncologist. In 1972, he also became their Director of Medical Education. He retired from St. Mary's in 2005.

He and his wife Jackie were married in 1962, and have four grown children: Michelle, Michael, Patricia and Katie.

Pat's key to selling so many raffle tickets was to specialize in other doctors and their medical staff. He would try to hit every doctor at the hospital, as well as their office.

The Carnival is a time for unique costumes for many Lions. Pat's favorite costume was the year he (and six other Lions) dressed up as the Seven Dwarves. Another Lion was Snow White. Pat also has fond memories of his grandsons joining him at the Parade on their bicycles, handing out candy.

Pat is a distinguished member of the community, and one of our top Lions in career ticket sales.

"Fade to Grey" was published recently under the pen name Marc Sanders.

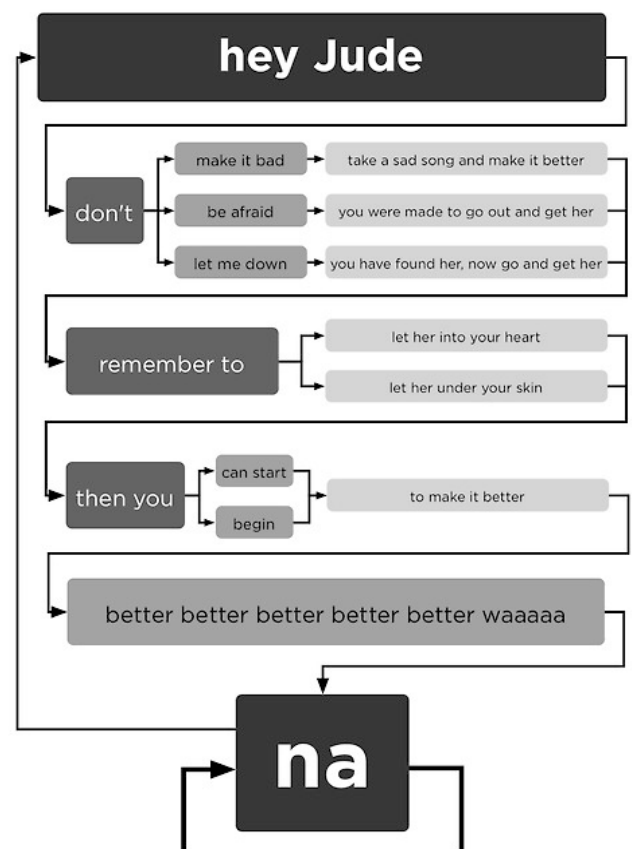
